## The Story Behind the Dr. Charles F. Whitten Awards

Dr. Charles F. Whitten was a trailblazer in medical education and sickle cell disease. During the early 1970s, he realized that services for people with sickle cell disease and their families were sorely lacking. Out of his pioneering efforts to advocate for the needs of people with sickle cell disease, the Sickle Cell Disease Association of America (SCDAA) was born.

In 1960 Dr. Whitten started a fund to help minority medical students with financial and academic assistance. He wrote many educational materials and was the recipient of many honors and awards. His papers are archived in the National Institutes of Health Library of Medicine. He was re-

ceived in the Oval office by three sitting U.S. presidents.

Dr. Whitten died in 2008. He is survived by his wife, Eloise (Culmer) Whitten; his daughter's Lisa Whitten, PhD and Wanda Whitten Shurney, MD.

The Sickle Cell Association of New Jersey is honored that the Whitten Family has permitted us to share in Dr. Whitten's legacy by allowing us to name our highest awards for service after this great champion for sickle cell disease.
