Afterwords Part 3: Telemedicine in Sickle Cell Disease

The telemedicine workshop presented by Kunal Sanghavi at SCANJ's Annual Symposium in 2015 was aimed at continuing to promote awareness and education for SCD telemedicine services as well as identify barriers and strategies for implementing telemedicine services in the New York-Mid-Atlantic Consortium for Genetics and Newborn Screening (NYMAC) region.

Patients with sickle cell disease (SCD) who live long distances from their specialty care center can have difficulty with clinic visit compliance. Consistent with its goal of ensuring timely access to quality care, NYMAC supported the launch of a telemedicine program for sickle cell disease (SCD) at the Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh. Since its inception in 2013, 11 families with SCD have completed a total of 80 telemedicine clinic sessions. These sessions have allowed the SCD specialist to prescribe hydroxyurea and monitor treatment progress and access to genetic counseling.

An onsite telemedicine training program has been established for pediatric hematologists and allied health professionals. Two training programs have been completed so far with teams from DE, NJ, NY, and VA. Telemedicine is a cost effective model of delivering and improving SCD services.


