Say It Loud! SCANJ's PSA Video Awareness Contest Set To Begin

Attention youth ages 13-25!

Help us spread the word about sickle cell disease by making a short video public service announcement (PSA). Our goals are to increase understanding of sickle cell disease and to raise awareness about related programs and services available in New Jersey.

There are two contest categories: competitive (open only to New Jersey residents between ages 13 and 25) and noncompetitive (open to anyone). In the competitive category, the first place winner will receive \$1000, second place wins \$600, and the third place winner will receive \$400. No monetary prizes will be awarded in the non-competitive category.

Entries will be judged based on their creativity, ability to inspire, accuracy of information and the WOW factor! The panel of judges will include health care professionals, individuals living with sickle cell disease, and professionals in the media and broadcast industry.

Please note that additional rules and eligibility requirements apply and will be posted, on or about Monday January 16 (Martin Luther King Day of Service) on event-brite.com.

Entries and complete registration form must be received no later than April 3, 2012. Winning entries for the competitive division will be notified by April 20, 2012. Winners will be announced in SCANJ's May 2012 newsletter.

Now Is The Time To Take Control Of Your Health

As you usher in the new year, you may, like many others, have resolved to take better care of yourself. That's especially important if you have an ongoing (chronic) condition like high blood pressure, diabetes, sickle cell disease or arthritis. On the other hand, you may feel like it's just not worth the effort. Why bother? No matter which scenario best describes your state of mind SCANJ can help. Sign up for our *free* Take Control of Your Health Workshops for the information and support you need to get motivated and stay motivated to live a healthier lifestyle.

Each workshop is held for approximately two and a half hours, once a week, for six weeks. The sessions deal with the issues that everyone living with a chronic health condition faces, such as how to:

- Manage medications
- Deal with depression
- Eat wisely and well
- Control pain
- Set and meet your goals
- Fight fatigue and frustration
- Start an appropriate exercise program
- Manage stress and learn to relax
- Communicate with your health care providers, family and friends

The program, which was developed at Stanford University, is led by trained and certified Peer Leaders, some of whom have chronic conditions themselves.

If you would like to learn how to conduct the workshops, 4 Day Peer Leader Training Certification begins Tuesday January 24th in Fords NJ. We still have a few slots available for the Fords sessions. Other Peer Leader Trainings for Newark and Cape May County are being scheduled and will be posted online soon.

The 6 Week TCYH Community Workshops will begin in March. SCANJ is proud to have been selected by the state of New Jersey to provide this program and to have been recognized for best practices in its implementation.
